

Routine Exam Room Cleaning Checklist

The following steps should be taken by practice staff for routine cleaning of exam rooms <u>after</u> <u>each patient</u> whether the patient is fully clothed throughout the visit or not. (Also, encourage patients to use hand sanitizer upon arrival and before leaving exam room.)

☐ Perform hand hygiene and don gloves.
☐ Remove the linen/paper covering on the exam table.
$\hfill \Box$ Wipe down the exam table with hospital-approved disinfectant wipes and allow to air dry per manufacturer's instructions on container.
$\ \square$ If a pillow is used, use and change disposable covers after every patient.
☐ Use hospital-approved disinfectant to thoroughly wipe down all non-disposable equipment that touches patients and allow to air dry per manufacturer's instruction on container. This includes but is not limited to:
 Blood pressure cuff/vital sign stand Stethoscope Otoscope Thermometer Oximeter (use alcohol swab, not disinfectant wipes) Other
☐ Use hospital-approved disinfectant to thoroughly wipe down all high-touch surfaces that have been touched by the patient and/or staff and allow to air dry per manufacturer's instructions on container. This includes but is not limited to:
 All horizontal surfaces (countertops and tables) Chairs Telephones Keyboards, mouse, WOW Door handles Other
$\hfill\Box$ Follow practice guidelines to indicate room and/or equipment has been cleaned/disinfected.
\square Remove gloves and perform hand hygiene.
